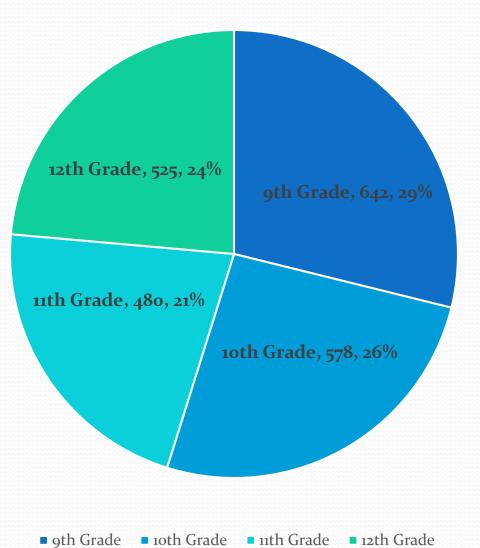

As of 09/23/2019 there are 2225 students enrolled in FPHS.

The projected enrollment was 2291.

FPHS is under the projection by 66 students which will require modifications to the budget on 09/30/19. This could result in a reduction of at least \$342,773.

Our Current Enrollment

Budget 2019-2020

- Projected Budget Per Pupil allocation of \$17.3 million based on a projected enrollment of 2291.
- Fixed Allocations (funded staff): \$2.5 million
- Replacement Equipment Allocation: \$95,344
- Total Allocations: \$17.3 million + carryover +/- enrollment
- Staffing/Flex Fund for 179 positions. Equates to \$15.1M/179 staff
- FPHS budget is operating at 87.4% if projections are met.
 - Actual count has us at 89.17%
 - That is approximately \$1.8 million in flex
 - Include stipends for extra periods (\$300k)

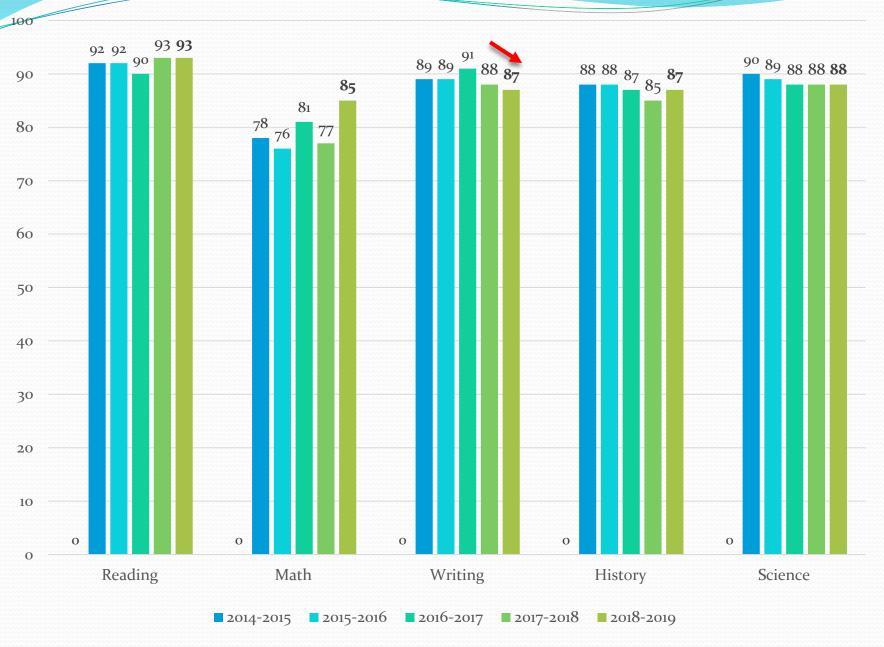

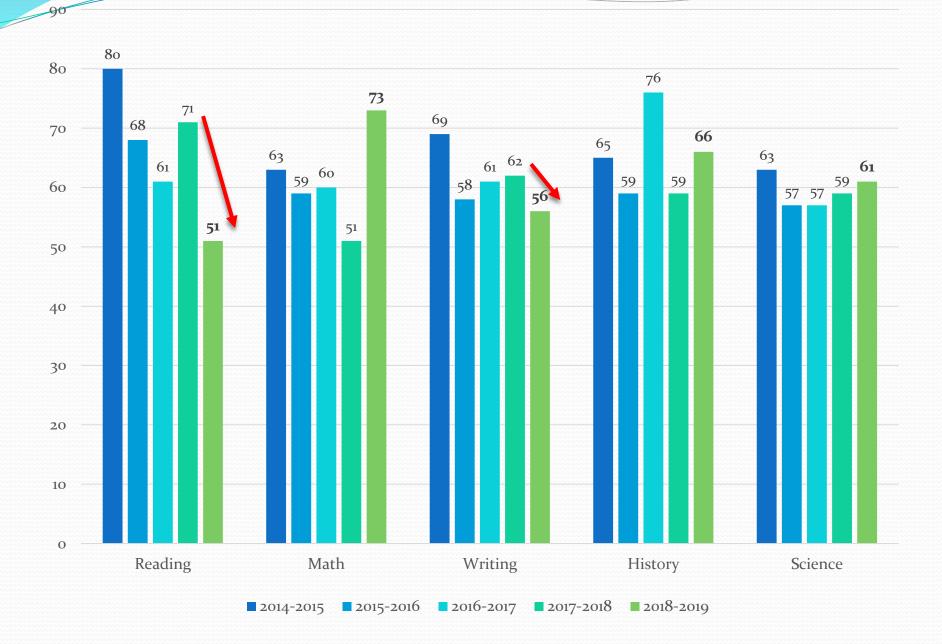
- Developed based on student requests

Strategic Plan

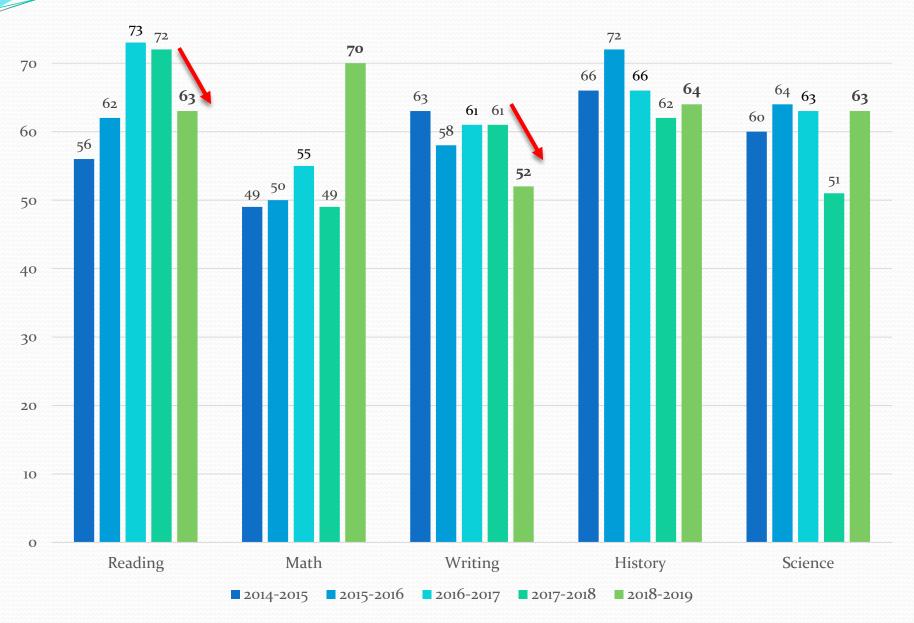
- We developed a one-year plan as opposed to a five-year plan.
- The Balanced Report Card has not been released yet
- VDOE will release accreditation report sometime this week
- PWCS simulations indicate FPHS will remain accredited
- Areas of focus upon review of available data:
 - English Performance
 - Achievement Gap
 - English Learners: -4.79% to -13.98%
 - Students with Disabilities: -26.15% to -32.2%
 - Math Performance
 - Achievement Gap
 - English Learners: -2.5% to -0.11%
 - Students with Disabilities: -32.37% to -22.96%
 - Absenteeism
 - Chronic Absenteeism Rate < 15%: 18.75% to 12.62%

%age of Students Passing by NCLB Subjects

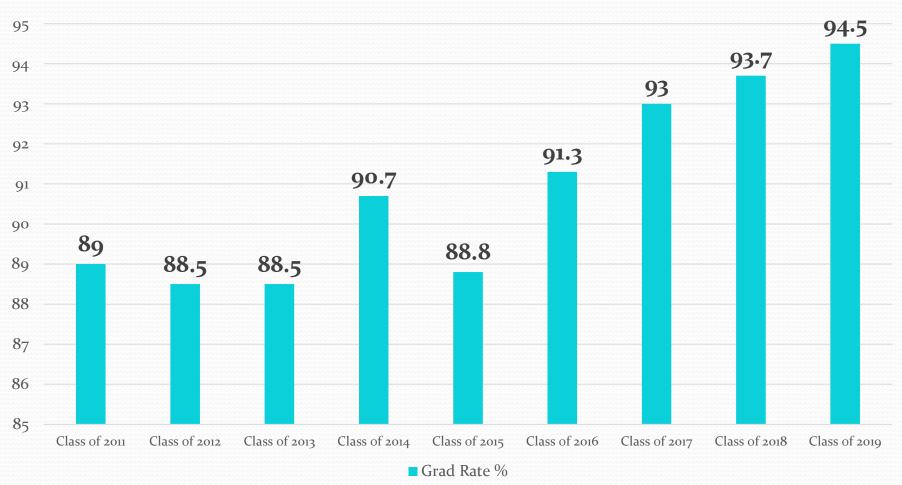








Grad Rate %
